Review of General Permitted Rights in relation to hill tracks in Scotland

Following the publication of our Track Changes report in November 2013 which made the case for the removal of Permitted Development Rights with regard to hill track construction, we understand you have recently been sent a report written in response by Scottish Land & Estates, The Way Ahead for Constructed Private Tracks.

Scottish Environment LINK is now pleased to enclose with this letter a copy of our report which responds to the arguments made in the Scottish Land & Estates document. While we welcome Scottish Land & Estates' comments and their engagement in this issue, we do not believe their report fundamentally challenges our case for the regulation of hill tracks. We continue to believe that the only way to ensure good standards of construction, and the balancing of public and private interests in such developments, is to bring track construction into the planning system.
