## NPF established in 2007

- A fundamental shift in approach in Scotland
- Abolition of departmental structures in Scottish Government discouraging silos
- Facilitate effective cross-cutting government
- A partnership approach across central and local government & all public services
- An outcomes-based approach with a shared Purpose, moving away from targets, inputs & outputs

## Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015

The Act places duty on Scottish Ministers to:

consult on, develop and publish a set of

national outcomes for Scotland;

- regularly and publicly report on progress towards these outcomes;
- review them at least every five years.
