2011/0166/MIN - Development of an underground mine to extract gold and silver with associated service and production building, plant, storage area, Tailings Management Facility (TMF), recirculation pond and gauging station, diversion of burn, access roads, bridge and car parking. Further revision of proposals Ref 90/01102/DET/S and Ref 2010/0017/MIN

Many Scottish Environment LINK members have been long-term supporters of National Parks in Scotland and specifically supported the creation of the Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park. Scottish Environment LINK members also continue to push for the creation of additional National Parks in Scotland. National Parks and National Park Authorities should be exemplars in the protection and enhancement of Scotland's natural and cultural heritage.

We do not wish to comment on the detailed merits or overall acceptability of the above application. However, the proposal would represent a significant industrial development in one of Scotland's National Parks and the decision of the National Park Authority could set an important precedent for similar development elsewhere. We therefore hope that the National Park Authority will give appropriate weight to the 4 aims of the National Park when considering this application and, as required by the National Parks (Scotland) Act 2000, give greater weight to the first aim, to conserve and enhance the natural and cultural heritage of the area¹. We also note that the first condition of identifying a National Park is that the area is of outstanding national importance because of its natural heritage or the combination of its natural heritage and cultural heritage². Before reaching a

decision on this proposal, the Authority must ensure it has considered whether this proposal is compatible with the nationally important, outstanding natural and cultural heritage of the area.

We trust that Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park Authority will make the right decision, taking into account the national importance of any major development in the National Park and the precedent it may set for future development in Scotland's National Parks.
