
DESCRIPTION

Beautiful metallic green day-flying moth, which may be found feeding at flowers such as Devil's-bit Scabious and Marsh Thistle. Its wingspan is between 25-30mm.

In Scotland, it is now confined to **Argyll** and **Dumfries & Galloway** on damp neutral grassland and woodland clearings. (The map shows all records, but some sites are unrecorded for more than 100 years).

The Forester Moth is a UK BAP Priority Species and is on the Scottish Biodiversity List.

THREATS

Declining due to loss of unimproved grassland, overgrazing, and loss of sunny woodland clearings.
