


Q1-3. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

"In Scotland we should use raw materials more wisely and waste less."






"Scotland needs an overall reduction in the amount of raw materials that are used."






"The Government should introduce a target and a plan on how to reduce the amount of raw materials used."






Q4-6. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

"When possible, products should be made so that they are easy to repair and their components can be re-used."




"The Government should make sure that people have access to repair and re-use services, as well as recycling services."






"The Government should use available powers to encourage companies to make products sold in Scotland repairable and re-useable."





Q7-8. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements?


"The Government should, wherever possible, only allow materials that are practicably and safely recyclable to be sold in Scotland."





"The Government should allow all materials to be sold in Scotland, regardless of whether they can be practicably and safely recycled."




Q9-10. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

"Producers and retailers have a responsibility for the environmental impact of their products."






"Producers whose products are not repairable or re-useable should pay a higher fee in Producer Responsibility schemes."






Q11. To what extent do you support or oppose a ban on all environmentally harmful single-use items where there are practical re-usable alternatives (with exclusions for certain groups)?






Q12–13 Do you think supermarkets should or should not have to do the following?
