

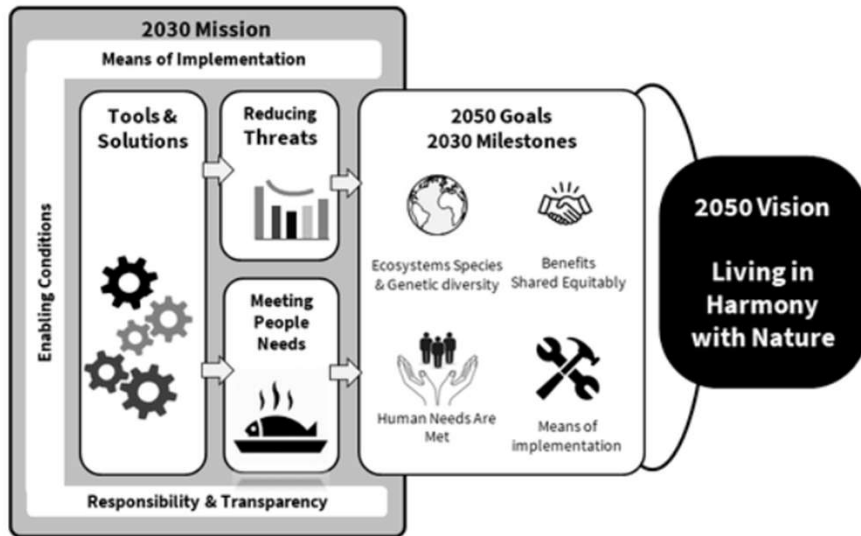

One Earth. One home. One shared future.

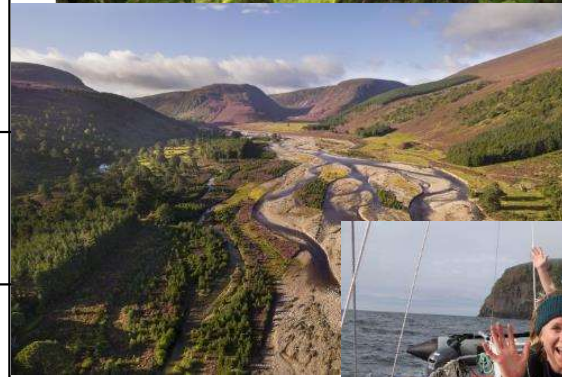

What are the principles for success?

Why	What	How
Vital to lead what we have to do over next decade	Shared ambition and aims towards ecosystem restoration	CBD draft zero indicates direction of travel but scale of action requires agreed ambition now
To enable everyone to create and share in public space where all stakeholders can be involved and contribute to success	Transparency	Transparent admin at SPA will enable everyone to contribute
Within the tight timescale a plan is vital for effective delivery	Clear process	Bringing new SBS and SPA alongside to avoid duplication and gaps
Too big for any single sector / actor to deliver alone	Inclusion	See transparency
Investing in impact & enabling money to flow toward outcomes: using traditional and non traditional funding to achieve outcomes through match & blended funding.	Funding over multi year:	east west wild; riverwoods, ASR fundraising approaches
Effective ecosystem restoration must tackle drivers of change	Tackling key drivers of loss	Align delivery mechanisms to achieve project roll out at temporal and spatial scale

Theme	Number of projects	Example costs of next steps
Investing in nature based solutions	8	£11,000,000+
Transforming land use and future rural support	6	£350,000 pa
Nature networks and green infrastructure	10	£5,190,000
Sustainable marine management and incentives	2 in delivery	£359,021 pa
Active travel networks	1 in delivery, 2 in scoping	£30,000
Investment in skills	3	£74,000,000
