Great Yellow Bumblebee



Canary in the coal mine? The Great Yellow now only exists in the far north & west of Scotland. It is especially sensitive to agricultural intensification and urbanisation, & the loss of extensive, flower-rich grasslands and severe habitat fragmentation.



By visiting flowers to collect pollen and nectar, they help crops and wildflowers to set seed, fruit and reproduce. A third of what we eat is pollinated by insects like bumblebees.
