





If you need funding Funding opportunities: Small Grants until 1st March

Our Small Grants Fund is open to **constituted community groups** and **organisations** based anywhere in Scotland that are led by refugees or focused on assisting refugee communities.

The Fund helps cover the costs of running events. You can apply for up to £750. We expect to support up to 70 events.

To apply, you need to fill in an application form on our website.

You will be asked to provide:

- Your details
- A short event proposal
- Explain how you are involving New Scots in the planning and delivery of your event
- A budget

Funding opportunities: Arts Open until 1st March

Arts Open will support **three artists** from a refugee or asylum-seeking background who are living in Scotland to present their work as part of the festival.

The three selected artists will receive:

- A grant of £1,000 for materials, expenses and other production costs
- Venue costs covered
- Support with event planning, delivery and promotion


