Dear Stuart McMillan MSP,

Congratulations on your re-election to the Scottish Parliament and your election as Convener of the Climate Action Committee.

[Stop Climate Chaos Scotland](#) and [Scottish Environment LINK](#), Scotland's climate and nature coalitions, recommend that the Climate Action Committee include **wildfire management** as an item on your workplan for this year. Given the severe fire in Abernethy and other recent wildfires around the country, it is critical that the Scottish Government develops at pace an effective strategy for limiting the number and scale of wildfires each year. This strategy must be developed in conjunction with land managers, and must support progress towards nature restoration and emissions reduction targets, not undermine these efforts.

The issue is complex and nuanced, so **we recommend a series of sessions on the subject**. Committee scrutiny would help to ensure that the Scottish Government considers a wide range of perspectives and evidence when developing their plans. Scottish Environment LINK have a wildfire subgroup which includes land-owning eNGOs who could provide evidence.

Thank you for considering this recommendation. Both of our organisations look forward to working with you and your committee colleagues over the course of this Parliament.
